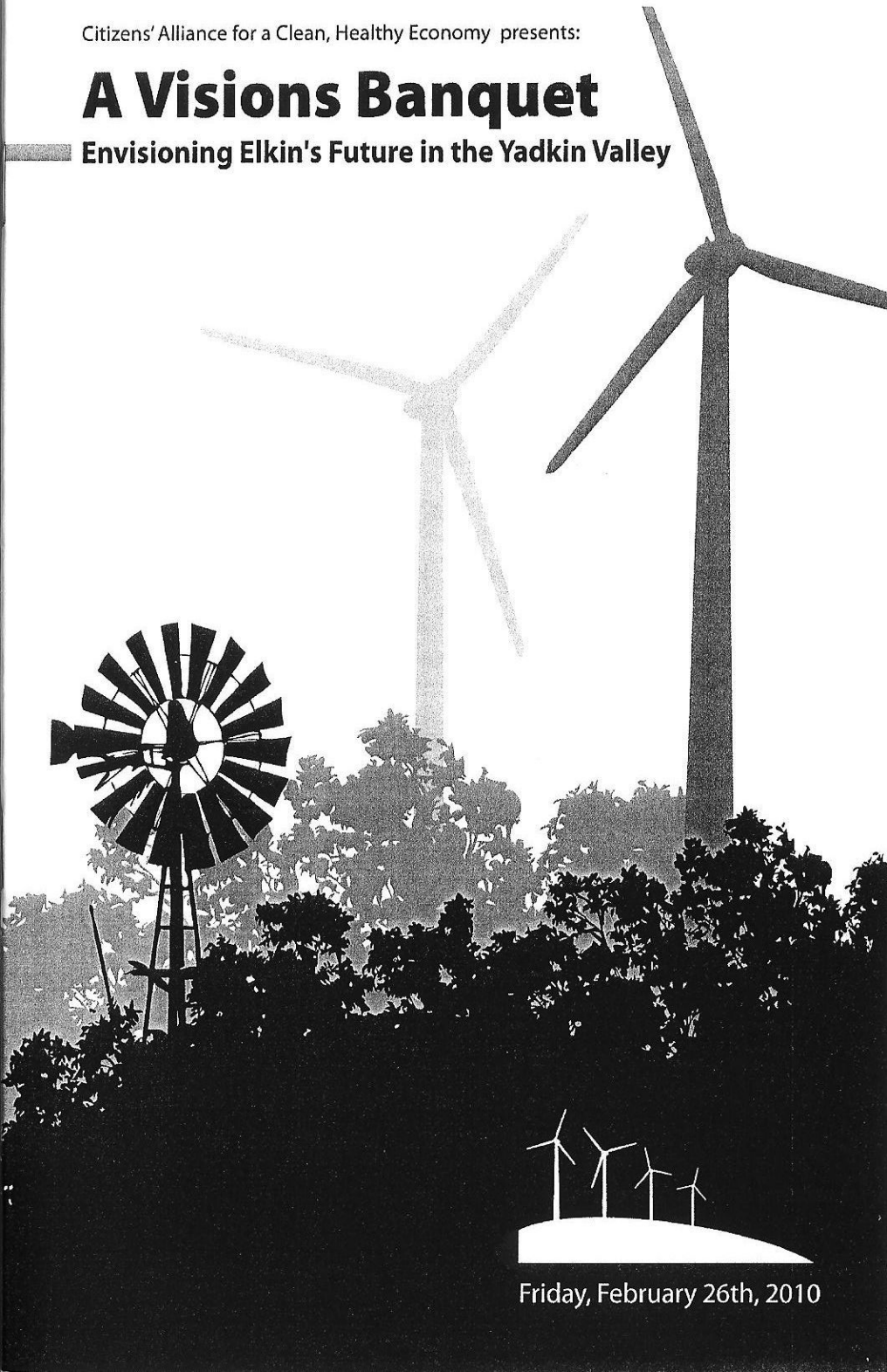

MR. DEAN NAUJOKS

Born in PA and raised on the Upper Delaware (National Scenic) River, Dean has over 18 years of environmental non-profit experience in North Carolina. He began his non-profit career with the NC Wildlife Federation for eight years from 1991-1999. After graduating cum laude from NC State University, with a degree in Environmental Policy and Sustainable Development, he started the first Upper Neuse Riverkeeper from 2001 to 2008. As of 2008, he has become the first Riverkeeper on the Yadkin River with Yadkin Riverkeeper, Inc.

His work with the Muddy Water Watch (MWW) Program in the Neuse Basin has developed into a successful statewide initiative; being seen as an effective tool to engage the public to monitor and keep construction sites in compliance with water quality laws. The MWW Program continues to grow nationally.

Dean has served on numerous boards and committees related to water quality and natural resource management.

During his tenure as Riverkeeper, the Neuse River Foundation received the North Carolina Wildlife Federation Governor's Achievement Award for the 2006 *Conservation Organization of the Year* as well as WRAL's *Dan Wilkinson Conservation Communication Award* in 2007 for "excellence in communicating environmental information."

Most recently, Dean has been awarded River Network's *2009 National River Heroes Award*. River Network's River Heroes Award celebrates rivers and those who protect them by recognizing victories and honoring those who provide leadership and inspiration along the way.

Dean lives in Winston-Salem with his wife Kathy and his daughter Krista Denali.

MR. HAL WEATHERMAN

Hal Weatherman is the Chief of Staff for United States Representative Sue Myrick. In this capacity, he oversees the operations of Rep. Myrick's 20 staff members located in Charlotte, Gastonia and Washington, DC.

Although a native of Charlotte, NC, Hal spent his formative years in Elkin before moving from there in 1986.

Hal is a graduate of Wake Forest University and received his Masters Degree from Wheaton College in Wheaton, Illinois.

A published author, Hal's first book *The Job Search Organizer*, was published nationwide by NTC Career Press. Hal chronicles his daily life in politics at halweatherman.com.

Hal, his wife Michelle, and their two sons, Hayes and Skyler, reside in Charlotte and are expecting their third child (a girl) in late March/early April.

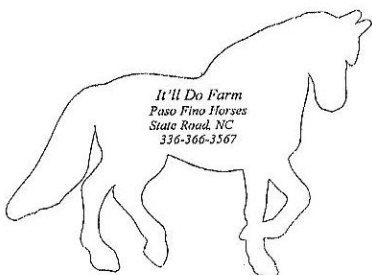

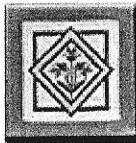
