

VOGTLE FUKUSHIMA?

The Fukushima I nuclear power plant is located in the towns of Okuma and Futaba, Japan. In March 2011 they were evacuated by government order because of the nuclear accident there. Together, Okuma and Futaba have a population of 19,000. Burke County has about 22,000 residents. If Plant Vogtle were to have an accident requiring evacuation, how would people know? How would residents be notified? Where would they go? What would be done for people who could not drive?

After the Fukushima accident, President Obama recommended that residents within 50 miles evacuate the area or “shelter in place.” What does shelter in place mean? Is it safe? How many residents are ready to evacuate or shelter in place? Are you ready?

Southern Company should be required to provide shelter and other protection from a nuclear accident at Vogtle for residents of Blythe, Girard, Keysville, Midville, Sardis, Vidette, Waynesboro and all residents of Burke County.
